LESSON OVERVIEW

Big Idea: We should make room in our hearts for Jesus
Key Question: What can we do to make Jesus a priority?
Memory Verse: "She will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us." Matthew 1:23

Overview: We're continuing in our Christmas series today! Christmas is such a fun time of year. We decorate our houses with beautiful lights and bake yummy things to eat throughout the season. And, of course, the presents are fun, too! But as we learned last week, Christmas is about so much more than all of that. Christmas is really about God's desire to have relationship with us. God sent Jesus into the world to be the Savior of the world. Last week we learned that Christmas is about relationships- first with Jesus but also with the people we care about. Today, we're going to talk about making room for Jesus in our lives. In the Christmas story, Jesus had to be born in a barn because there was no room in the inn. We need to make room for Jesus in our hearts. We should never say to Jesus, "I don't have room in my life for you." He's the most important person we can ever know. We should make him our top priority by doing things like reading the Bible and praying. Even though it's great to celebrate Jesus at Christmas, we should celebrate him everyday. So, make sure to make room for him in your life.

Why should we spend time with him? 4-5th: What do you spend most of your free time doing? How can you add Jesus into that list?

Classroom Activities **K-1st**

Option #1

Jingle Bell Toss

- Set up the game before kids arrive. Using 10 red solo cups, set them up as follows: 1 cup at top with a 10 written on it (worth 10 points), then a row of 2 cups with a 5 written on each cup (worth 5 points), then a row of 3 cups with a 3 written on each cup (worth 3 points), and then a row of 4 cups with a 1 written on each cup (worth 1 point). **should make a triangle shape. You might want to place something in each cup so they don't tip over easily.
- Tape two lines on the floor for the kids to stand behind.
- Divide the class into 2 teams and have them line up behind each line.
- Give each kid a mini jingle bell.
- The point of the game is to get the most points by getting the bell to land in a cup. One kid will throw at a time and will alternate between each team. The teacher will need to tally the points as each kid throws. They get points based on the cup the bell lands in **(see points above)**
- Team with the most points wins.

Supplies needed

- Red solo cups, 10 per class
- Black sharpie/marker
- Mini jingle bells, 1 per kid
- Tape

Bonus Activity:

Play Memory Verse.

Say the memory verse as a class. Say it again while **marching** in place. Say it again while **clapping**.

Option #2

Nativity Scene Craft

- Give each kid a Nativity template (page 5).
- Have them cut out each animal/person.
- Have them color each piece.
- Have them glue each piece onto a large craft stick.
- As the kids work, read the Christmas story from **Luke 2:1-17**. Encourage kids to go home and tell their parents the story of Jesus' birth using their stick figures to tell the story.
- If kids run out of time, give them a baggie to put their pieces in so they can finish it at home.

Supplies needed

- Nativity template (pg 5), 1 per kid
- Scissors
- Crayons
- Large craft sticks, 1 per kid
- Glue
- Sandwich baggies

Bonus Activity: Play Telephone.

Have the class sit in a circle. Whisper the **Big Idea** in the ear of a kid. Have them whisper it to the kid on their right. Continue around the circle. The last kid has to say aloud the message they heard.

- 1. Read Acts 4:12. Who came to save us from our sins? Why is Jesus the only one who could do that?
- 2. Read Luke 19:10. How did Jesus save us? Why do we need to be saved?
- 3. Read John 3:17. Jesus came to save us, not to punish us. How can you show Jesus how much you love him this week?
