TEACHER'S GUIDE

LESSON OVERVIEW

Big Idea: Faith is a fancy word for trusting JesusKey Question: How do we trust Jesus?Memory Verse: This is how God loved the world: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16

Overview: We're continuing our series called the Grid. Grid is just a fancy word for how you look at life. We've already learned that a Christian Grid means we see life the way Jesus does. We've already learned how important the Bible, God's Truth, is to a Christian grid. We've also learned how important it is to love: God first and others second. This week, we're going to learn about how important faith is to a Christian grid. Faith is just a fancy word for trusting in Jesus. The Bible says that in order to have a relationship with God we have to trust in what Jesus did for us on the cross. He had to die to pay for our sins that had broken our relationship with God. No amount of smarts or good deeds could ever be good enough to fix our relationship with God. The only way is through Jesus. That's why faith is so important to a Christian grid. If we don't put our faith in Jesus, then we can't be in relationship with God. And, if we don't have a relationship with God, we won't see life the way he does.

Classroom Activities **2nd-5th**

Option #1

Jesus is a lifesaver game

- Put a piece of tape on the floor at one end of the room for each team to line up behind. Do the same at the other end of the room.
- Have the class divide into teams of 4-5. Have half the team line up at one end of the room behind the tape and the other half across at the other end of the room.
- Give the first kid in each line at one end of the room a piece of twine or yarn.
- Give every kid a lifesaver candy.
- When you say, "Go!" Have the first kid in line at one end of the room put their lifesaver on the twine and then run to the other end to the first person in line at that end. That kid has to put their lifesaver on the twine and race back to the other side. Continue until every kid has had a turn.
- If any candy falls off the twine, that team is out. First team to get all their lifesavers on the twine wins.

Supplies needed

- Tape
- Twine or yarn, cut into 12 in. pieces, 1 per team
- Lifesaver candies (hard), 1 piece per kid

Bonus Activity: Play Find the Book in the Bible.

Have the class get into pairs. Give each pair a Bible. Have them race to find the books below. First to find has to say if it's in the OT or NT

Option #2

Salvation Bracelet

- Give each kid a piece of twine.
- Give each kid colored beads, one of each color.
- As a class, work together to put each bead onto the twine As they add each bead, tell them what that color represents for telling someone how Jesus saves us.
 - **Black**: represents our sin that keeps us from having a relationship with God.
 - **Red:** represents Jesus' blood when he died on the cross to pay for our sins.
 - White: represents that Jesus rose again and gives us new life. Now we live to honor him not ourselves..
 - **Yellow:** represents heaven where we get to live with Jesus some day.
- Then, help kids tie their bracelets onto their wrists.
- Give each kid the bead template **(page 5)** so they can remember what the colors mean.

Supplies needed

- Twine, cut into 8 in pieces,1 per kid
- Colored bracelet beads (need black, red, white, yellow for each kid)
- Bead template (pg 5), pre cut, 1 per kid
