# HOW STUFF WORKS: GREED

#### **TEACHER'S GUIDE**

#### LESSON OVERVIEW

**Big Idea**: The cure for the "gimmies" is being happy with what God has given you **Key Question**: What does it mean to be greedy? **Memory Verse**: And this same God who takes care of me will supply all your needs from his glorious riches, which have been given to us in Christ Jesus. **Philippians 4:19** 

**Overview:** We're continuing in our series called, "How Stuff Works". It's important to know how stuff works so we don't make mistakes that can hurt us or those we care about. We've already learned how our feelings should work. God created us to have them but we need to know how to control them. Last week, we learned about friendship. God designed us to want to have friends but we need to choose the right kind of friends. Our friends will rub off on us, for the good or the bad. We become more like the people we hang around. So, we need to choose our friends wisely! Today, we're going to talk about greed. Greed is just a fancy word for when you have the "gimmies". You know, when you want something you don't really need. Here's how the "gimmies" work. You go to the grocery store with your mom and you see yummy chips or cereal and you say, "Mom! I want this or I want that!" Or, you go to your friend's house and they have the cool new game, so you go home and say, "Mom, I have to have it because everyone else has it!" See how that works? Greed, or the "gimmies", gets us in trouble because our focus is on stuff. We don't NEED stuff, but we might WANT stuff. It's important to know the difference. God doesn't want us to be greedy. He wants to cure us of the "gimmies". The cure is being thankful for what we already have!

### Option #1

### Gimmie Heart vs. Happy Heart Game

- Draw a large heart on the whiteboard and draw a line to divide in half
- Write "Gimmie" on one side and "Happy" on the other
- Have kids take turns drawing a little heart saying **(pg 5)** out of a basket. Have kids read the saying to the class and decide if it belongs on the "Gimme" side or the "Happy" side. Have the kid tape it to the correct side
- Continue having kids pull a saying until all have been placed on the heart
- If time allows, have kids come up with a few examples of their own to include
- Remind kids that we should be thankful for what we have instead of wishing we had more

## Option #2

### Gimmie Heart vs. Happy Heart Craft

- Give each kid a heart and a sayings template (pg 6)
- Have kids cut out the heart and sayings
- Using a black marker, have them write the word "Gimmie" at the top of the left side and the word "Happy" at the top of the right side
- Have them color the left side of the heart black and the other half red (don't color over the words at the top)
- As a class, read each little heart saying and decide if it goes on the "Gimmie" side or the "Happy" side. Then have kids glue each one on the correct side
- As a class, come up with another example for a "Gimmie" and a "Happy" statement. Have kids write them on the blank hearts provided. Have them glue those on the correct side, too
- Remind kids that the only cure for the "gimmies" is being happy with what you already have






